A WORD FROM PASTOR JIM:

There are a lot of reasons people come to church. You could name a few; some are good reasons, while others are questionable. While a person might come to church for many reasons, there is only one way that people come to church. It's not by bus, train, plane or automobile. The only way that we come to church is by God's grace. We are part of this parish only because of the Love of God the Father through the grace of Jesus Christ while the Holy Spirit makes it real to us. We are a community of believers who come together to worship God and do life together.

We are blessed to do life together with little to no fear that something terrible will happen to us at church. This is not true in some churches around the world and was definitely not true in the German Lutheran church of the 1930s and 1940s. In the 1930s, German Nazism began to influence the State Church, the Lutheran Church. One man who was outspoken about the rise of the Furor was Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Bonhoeffer would not bend his knee to the dictator to secure his clerical job, and he joined the Confessing Movement. This movement was formed so they could study and minister without compromising the Word of God. They also came together to support one another in their struggle, not only against the Third Reich but in their battle against this world's systems, Satan, and Self.

How did the Confessing Movement have the strength to come together week in and week out as war raged around them? Bonhoeffer explained it this way:

It is true, of course, that what is an unspeakable gift of God for the lonely individual is easily disregarded and trodden under foot by those who have the gift every day. It is easily forgotten that the fellowship of Christian brethren is a gift of grace, a gift of the Kingdom of God that any day may be taken from us, that the time that still separates us from utter loneliness may be brief indeed. Therefore, let him who until now has had the privilege of living a common Christian life with other Christians praise God's grace from the bottom of his heart. Let him thank God on his knees and declare: It is grace, nothing but grace, that we are allowed to live in community with Christian brethren.

Sisters and Brothers, we need each other. We need to breathe in the Love of God the Father through the grace of the Lord Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit, but we also need to breathe out that love to those around us by working together to fulfill God's will in our lives. We become the Body of Christ when we come together to worship, serve, and love God and one another.

John Wesley explained it this way, "Christianity is essentially a social religion; and that to turn it into a solitary religion, is indeed to destroy it." What is Wesley saying? Basically, Christianity should be done together as a team, not merely as an individual. We should strive to come together not primarily for our good but for the good of our brothers and sisters in Christ. Jesus expressed it this way in Matthew 20:

"You know that the rulers in this world lord it over their people, and officials flaunt their authority over those under them. But among you, it will be different.

Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must become your slave.

For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many."
