### A WORD FROM PASTOR JIM:

Well baseball season is about over, and I have not really kept up with any of my favorite teams. I know the Royals made the playoffs but that's about it. But when I was young, I loved playing baseball, and I loved catching. The catcher is the only player on the field that can see all the action. The pitcher can't see everyone because they are looking at the catcher most of the time. The infielders can't see the outfielders. The outfielder can't watch the other outfielders as they are watching the batter. Only the catcher can see everything that's going on. The backstop has a unique perspective on the game and sometimes based on what's going on in the game might bark out an unusual direction. That direction comes because the catcher can see things other players can't see.

For example, in one game that I caught, the other team had the bases loaded and I think one out. The pitcher threw a couple of pitches, and I noticed that the runner on first base would get over half way down the second base before that pitch crossed on plate. He also took his sweet time getting back to first. Seeing this I called the infielders to the mound. I told them about the baserunner. I said, this is what I want to do. The next pitch I am going to call for a pitch out and throw it down to first. I think we can get the runner out before they get back to the bag and before the other two runners try to advance. The rest of the infielders were not sure about the idea but gave their approval.

Working out of the stretch, the pitcher threw the pitch out. The ball made a thud as it hit my glove. I quickly threw it down to first base. In fact, almost too quickly as the throw was a little wild. It soared high, but thankfully my first baseman was tall. He made a jumping catch. Put on the tag as he came down, and the runner was out. We got out of the inning without allowing any more runs as the pitcher ended up striking out the batter. All because I could see things that the rest of the team could not or did not see.

Think of God as the "catcher of your life." You can't see everything that is going on in your life. You might know where some things in your life are headed but you can't see everything or everyone. Thankfully God can! He can see things you can't see. He knows things you can't know. He wants things... good things, for you that you don't even know you need. So what happens? God sees the game called your life from a unique place. So, God "barks out" a course of action. You might think why does God want me to do that? I really don't know if that will work or not. The question becomes, "Do you listen or do you throw the proverbial ball where you want?" I want to encourage you to go with God's instructions because He sees things we can't even fathom.


